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Introduction

This guide details the Year 10 and 11 curriculum. All subjects adhere to the Cambridge IGCSE Programmes of Study, providing a seamless transition from Primary School through Key Stages 3 and 4. This internationally recognised curriculum allows students to pursue higher education globally. Student progress, assessed on a 9 -1 grading scale, will be reported three times per year, enabling you to track your child's academic development.

Information about Cambridge Assessment International Examinations and IGCSEs

Cambridge Assessment International Examinations (CAIE), a leading global provider of international education programmes and qualifications for students aged 5 to 19, is part of the University of Cambridge. These qualifications are highly regarded by top universities and employers worldwide.

The IGCSE programme, the most popular international qualification for 14 to 16-year-olds, is widely recognised as evidence of academic ability. It offers flexibility in learning and subject choice. While we do not offer the full range, students can choose from around 70 subjects available globally.

IGCSE courses are taught in over 140 countries and nearly 3,700 schools, including 1,300 in the UK. Many UK schools are choosing IGCSEs over their non-international counterparts due to their increased rigour and breadth.

The Structure of IGCSEs courses and examinations

This guide outlines the course content and exam format for each subject. However, as each subject has its own specific details, we strongly recommend reviewing the full syllabus information on the CAIE website. You can find the relevant website details below.

The Purpose and Function of IGCSEs

IGCSEs are the world's most popular international qualifications for students aged 14 to 16. They open doors to higher education and professional studies, both at home and abroad. IGCSEs can help you:

- Secure a place at a college or university in another country.
- Enhance your career prospects.
- Meet language requirements for emigration or studying abroad. For instance, a Grade C in IGCSE English often fulfils the language criteria for certain universities in English-speaking countries.
- Develop valuable skills for a fulfilling and successful life.

Grading and Reporting

Cambridge IGCSE results are reported using internationally recognised 9–1 grades. Exam papers may be marked centrally in the UK or via electronically transferred scripts to examiners around the world.

Most subjects follow the 9–1 grading scale, but a few exceptions still use the A–G system*, including Portuguese (first language), Psychology and Travel and Tourism.

9–1 grades correspond to performance as follows:

- 9 – High A*
- 8 – Low A* / High A
- 7 – A
- 6 – High B
- 5 – Low B / High C
- 4 – Low C
- 3 – D / E
- 2 – F
- 1 – G
- U – Ungraded

Key points:

- 9 is the highest grade; 1 is the lowest.
- Ungraded (U) indicates performance below grade G.
- Ungraded results appear on the statement of results but not on the certificate.

In specific circumstances candidates may see one of the following letters on their statement of results:

- Q (PENDING)
- X (NO RESULT). These letters do not appear on the certificate.

On the statement of results, Cambridge IGCSE is shown as INTERNATIONAL GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION (IGCSE). On certificates, Cambridge IGCSE is shown as International General Certificate of Secondary Education.

How to make choices of subjects

This booklet contains information about the course choices available to Year 10 students in August 2026 at Bright International School, Loulé.

After the IGCSE Presentation to Parents, students will be asked to make their final choices for their IGCSE options.

In choosing they should think carefully about the following points:

- What do I enjoy?
- What am I good at?
- What do I need for future A level choices?
- Do I have a good balance of subjects that plays to my strengths and interests?

The Year 10 and 11 Curriculum

The curriculum for Years 10 and 11 is broken down into 3 distinct parts:

1. Non-examined core curriculum material;
2. Core IGCSE examined subjects;
3. Option based examined subject material.

All students will follow a course of non-examined curriculum in these subject areas:

- Physical Education
- Wellbeing

In addition, all students will study a minimum of four core IGCSE subjects, some of which are compulsory. These include:

Group 1 - Languages: English (either First Language or Second Language). Students also have the option to choose Portuguese - First Language and/or Literature in English. Any student enrolled in English First Language must also take Literature in English, as it is a core requirement.

Group 2 - Mathematics

Group 3 - Sciences: At least one Science (students may, however, choose to study up to three Sciences, from Biology, Chemistry, and Physics).

Please note that the availability of some optional subjects depends on sufficient student interest.

Advice on Choosing subjects

We will run a series of sessions on the general skills needed to choose IGCSE options.

Any student who remains unsure about their choices after the Students Options Workshops should consult the relevant subject teachers or their Form Tutor.

Students opting for French or Spanish as a Foreign Language are generally expected to start the course with a foundation in the language equivalent to CEFR level A1, usually acquired through one to two years of prior study.

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to take a minimum of eight (8) and a maximum of ten (10) IGCSE subjects. This will depend on how many Science subjects they take as part of their CORE IGCSEs. To progress to A Level, students must achieve a minimum of six (6) IGCSE passes at grade C/5 or above. Please note that certain subjects may have specific grade requirements for admission into corresponding A Level courses.

Cambridge IGCSE: Provision for Students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

Cambridge International is dedicated to ensuring inclusive education for all learners, including those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

To support SEND students during assessments, Cambridge International provides a variety of access arrangements.

These may include:

- Modified question papers, such as those in enlarged print or braille.
- Additional support, including reading assistance, scribes, or assistive technologies.
- Extra time or supervised breaks to address specific requirements.

At Bright International School, we collaborate closely with Cambridge International to implement these accommodations, creating an inclusive environment that meets the diverse needs of our students.

To apply for access arrangements, a report from a qualified assessor is required. This assessment must be conducted no earlier than Year 9 (i.e., within three years of the exams). We recommend a full educational psychological assessment to ensure a comprehensive understanding of the student's needs.

The school can suggest qualified assessors to parents; however, the cost of the assessment is the responsibility of the parents. These measures ensure that all students have the opportunity to reach their full potential while upholding the integrity of the qualifications.

Art and Design (0989)

Drama (0994)

English First Language (0990)

First Language English (9-1) focuses on developing essential skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. They also practise different writing styles, from creative writing to formal essays, and participate in discussions and presentations to improve their oral communication skills.

Learners are encouraged to read widely, both for their own enjoyment and to further their awareness of the ways in which English can be used.

English – Literature in English (0992)

Cambridge IGCSE Literature in English (9-1) offers learners the opportunity to read, interpret, evaluate and respond to a range of literature in English, including drama, prose and poetry from Shakespeare to contemporary works. Through four hours of weekly instruction, this course enables learners to deepen their understanding and appreciation of how writers use English to express meaning and achieve effects.

Cambridge IGCSE Literature in English will stimulate learners to read for pleasure and to explore wider and universal issues, promoting a better understanding of themselves and the world.

What will lead to success in this course?	How is the course assessed?	Exam board and specification
<p>Success in this course stems from active engagement with the texts and a willingness to explore the world of literature. This involves close reading and analysis of the set texts, paying attention to language, structure, and themes, and developing your ability to interpret and evaluate what you read. Cultivate curiosity and explore beyond the curriculum. Discover other works by the same authors, delve into related genres and research the historical contexts of the texts. Engage in discussions and collaborate with your classmates, sharing your ideas and seeking diverse perspectives. 
